- BC Confederation of PACs registered nonprofit that represents parents of children attending public schools in BC

New Business:

- 1. Principal Update
 - a. Brett City of Burnaby (CoB) Parks and Rec Program Coordinator for SE communities
 - i. Oversees after school programs out of Armstrong
 - ii. Open to feedback for programs we'd like to see
 - iii. Fall programming available for registration
 - iv. Still have spaces this year, particularly for preschool-aged
 - v. Fair Play Program Financial Assistance and Inclusion for Residents program (takes place of recreation credit program). Can receive credits towards programs if they qualify (income level, certain groups). Under 14yrs old, can receive \$500 towards programming (e.g. after school, arts, swimming).
 - vi. Grade 5 BeActive program all grade 5 students in Burnaby get a full access pass to gymnasiums, pools, driving ranges. Fill out the application

- form, then take it to any rec centre for your pass. Gr 5 is a critical age for building healthy lifestyles
- vii. Every school is eligible for free support for up to 4hrs if running an event CoB Rec can provide activities! (e.g. life-sized lego-like blocks, face painting, big games, craft table) Any additional hours, would have to pay staff wages
- viii. Programs: crafts, leadership (older), babysitting (older)
- ix. Access Coordinator for the year eligible 120hours yearly of additional support for free (assuming staff availability). Other programming specific for youths and adults
- x. School programs usually scheduled seasonally (Sept-Dec, Jan-mid-March, April-June), but may be able to add on programs depending on staffing

b. School Growth Plan Goals

- i. Literacy emerging and developing literacy
- ii. School Development goal exploring explicit and intentional strategies to build attunement

c. School opening

- i. Why temporary classes
 - Many registrations over the summer that impact organization and numbers
 - 2. Do preliminary organization in June
 - 3. Sometimes have to add a class or take away
 - 4. Takes time because every day in the first week, school is sending in numbers to the district for them to look at bigger picture
 - Once school receives approval, then students move to their new classes as quickly as able
 - 6. Year to year it can vary

d. Combined grades (split classes)

- i. 21 divisions with only 5 classes that are not combined grades
- ii. Combined grades intention is not for students to get only lower grade or higher grade curriculum
- iii. Students get curriculum relative to their grade
- iv. Learning is developmental, not based on grade silos

- v. Curriculum is very similar from grade to grade
- vi. Curricular competencies will be the common thread to working through the curriculum
- vii. Due to class size limits and class composition requirements, we will continue to have combined grades
- e. Parking lot rules
 - i. Consider the health and safety of students, staff, and families
 - ii. Please do not block crosswalks
- f. All classes are paired up with buddy classes
 - i. Intermediate are big buddies for Primary
 - ii. Aim for a 4 year split
 - iii. Do events together throughout the year

- Gr 6/7 leadership work in this area
- Suggestion: during morning announcements, every student is accountable to keep the school beautiful and clean by putting the garbage in the bin

Locks on bathroom doors were not working

- Keys for the exterior bathroom doors
- Don't have staff to consistently lock/unlock doors
- Concerns around safety, if they get unlocked then may not get re-locked
- They are remaining locked at this time to preserve building security
- Kids need to go around to the front of the school
